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Post hemorrhoid surgery

Pain control

- For pain control please take the following
 - Acetaminophen (Tylenol) 1000 mg every 6 hours for the first three days, then every 6 hours as needed
 - □ Ibuprofen (Advil) 400 mg every 6 hours for the first three days, then every 6 hours as needed
 - ☐ Metronidazole (Flagyl) 500 mg every 12 hours for 7 days
 - This is an antibiotic, but has been shown to decrease pain
 - □ Hydromorphone
 - Follow the directions on the prescription

Constipation

• Certain pain medications can be constipating which can be quite painful after surgery. Please take PEG 3350 (Restoralax/Lax-a-day) 17g a day to avoid constipation

Wound care

- Please soak in a tub/sitz bath of warm water for 10-15 minutes twice a day. This will help keep the wounds clean, and may help sooth pain
- There may be some drainage or light bleeding from the wound. Place a dry piece of gauze to protect your undergarments
